### File Contents

#### 1. Emulsion\_Design\_Tool\_June08.xls

This file contains the spreadsheet design tool for use within Microsoft Excel. Users will be required to enable 'Enable Macros' on starting this tool. If you have the security settings in Excel set on high, you will need to first open excel, click

Tools>Macro>Security

Change the security setting to 'Medium' and close Excel.

Now open the design tool and click on 'Enable Macros'

#### 2. Emulsion\_Design\_Tool\_Manual\_7\_1\_08.pdf

This file contains the users manual for the Emulsion Design Tool including a detailed description of all required input. Appendix III at the end of the manual provides a detailed, step by step tutorial that walks users through an example problem.

#### 3. Powerpoint\_Overview.zip

This zip file contains an overview of the design tool. Once you unpack the file, you will find subdirectory called "Powerpoint\_Overview". Inside the subdirectory, click on the file "Powerpoint\_Overview.htm". Your default web browser should open showing the first slide of the overview presentation. If you do not have the most recent version of Quicktime, you will need to download and install this viewer. You may need to enable ActiveX controls for the presentation to run properly. You should also turn on the sound to your computer to hear the narration.

- To start the narration, click 'play'.
- Once the narration ends, click next to advance to the next slide.
